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IFRA Category Details For Finished Product Types

<p>Category 1 - Products applied to the lips Lip Products of all types (solid and liquid lipsticks, balms, clear or colored, etc.); Children's toys.</p>
<p>Category 2 - Products applied to the axillae Deodorant and antiperspirant products of all types including any product with intended or reasonably foreseeable use on the axillae or labelled as such (spray, stick, roll-on, under-arm, deo-cologne, etc.); Body sprays (including body mist).</p>
<p>Category 3 - Products applied to the face/body using finger tips Eye products of all types (eye shadow, mascara, eyeliner, eye make-up, eye masks, eye pillows, etc.) including eye care and moisturizer; Facial make up and foundation; Make-up remover for face and eyes; Nose pore strips; Wipes or refreshing tissues for face, neck, hands, body; Body and face paint (for children and adults); Facial masks for face, lips and around the eyes.</p>
<p>Category 4 - Products related to fine fragrance Hydroalcoholic and non-hydroalcoholic fine fragrance of all types (eau de toilette, parfum, cologne, solid perfume, fragrancing cream, aftershaves of all types, etc.); Perfumed bracelets; Ingredients of perfume kits and fragrance mixtures for cosmetics kits; Scent pads, foil packs; Scent strips for hydroalcoholic products.</p>
<p>Category 5 - Products applied to the face and body using the hands (palms), primarily leave-on</p>
<p>Category 5A - Body lotion products applied to the body using the hands (palms), primarily leave-on Body creams, oils, lotions of all types; Foot care products (creams & powders); Insect repellent (intended to be applied to the skin); All powders and talcs (excluding baby powders and talc).</p>
<p>Category 5B - Face Moisturizer products applied to the face using the hands (palms), primarily leave-on Facial toner; Face moisturizers and creams.</p>
<p>Category 5C - Hand Cream products applied to the hands using the hands (palms), primarily leave-on Hand cream; Nail care products including cuticle creams etc.; Hand sanitizers.</p>
<p>Category 5D - Baby Creams, baby Oils and baby talc Baby cream/lotion, baby oil, baby powders and talc.</p>
<p>Category 6 - Products with oral and lip exposure Toothpaste; Mouthwash, including breath sprays; Toothpowder, strips, mouthwash tablets.</p>
<p>Category 7 - Products applied to the hair with some hand contact</p>
<p>Category 7A - Rinse-off products applied to the hair with some hand contact Hair permanent or other hair chemical treatments (rinse-off) (e.g. relaxers), including rinse-off hair dyes.</p>
<p>Category 7B - Leave-on products applied to the hair with some hand contact Hair sprays of all types (pumps, aerosol sprays, etc.); Hair styling aids (mousse, gels, leave in conditioners); Hair permanent or other hair chemical treatments (leave-on) (e.g. relaxers), including leave-on hair dyes; Shampoo - Dry (waterless shampoo); Hair deodorizer.</p>
<p>Category 8 - Products with significant anogenital exposure Intimate wipes; Tampons; Baby wipes; Toilet paper(wet).</p>
<p>Category 9 - Products with body and hand exposure, primarily rinse off Bar soap; Shampoo of all type; Cleanser for face (rinse-off); Conditioner (rinse-off); Liquid soap; Body washes and shower gels of all types; Baby wash, bath, shampoo; Bath gels, foams, mousses, salts, oils and other products added to bathwater; Foot care products (feet are placed in a bath for soaking); Shaving creams of all types (stick, gels, foams, etc.); All depilatories (including facial) and waxes for mechanical hair removal; Shampoos for pets.</p>
<p>Category 10 - Household care products with mostly hand contact</p>
<p>Category 10A - Household care excluding aerosol products (excluding aerosol/spray products products) Hand wash laundry detergent (including concentrates); Laundry pre-treatment of all types (e.g. paste, sprays, sticks); Hand dishwashing detergent (including concentrates); Hard surface cleaners of all types (bathroom and kitchen cleansers, furniture polish, etc.); Machine laundry detergents with skin contact (e.g. liquids,</p>

<p>Category 11 - Products with intended skin contact but minimal transfer of fragrance to skin from inert substrate</p>
<p>Category 11A - Products with intended skin contact but minimal transfer of fragrance to skin from inert substrate without UV exposure Feminine hygiene conventional pads, interlabial pads; Diapers (baby and adult); Adult incontinence pant, pad; Toilet paper (dry).</p>
<p>Category 11B - Products with intended skin contact but minimal transfer of fragrance to skin from inert substrate with potential UV exposure Tights with Moisturizers; Scented socks, gloves; Facial tissues (dry tissues); Napkins; Paper towels; Wheat bags; Facial masks (paper/protective) e.g. surgical masks not used as medical device; Fertilizers, solid (pellet or powder).</p>
<p>Category 12 - Products not intended for direct skin contact, minimal or insignificant transfer to skin Candles of all types (including encased); Laundry detergents for machine wash with minimal skin contact (e.g. liquid tabs, pods); Automated air fresheners and fragrancing of all types (concentrated aerosol with metered doses (range 0.05-0.5mL/spray), plug-ins, closed systems, solid substrate, membrane delivery, electrical, powders, fragrancing sachets, incense, liquid refills, air freshening crystals); Air delivery systems; Cat litter; Cell phone cases; Deodorizers/maskers not intended for skin contact (e.g. fabric drying machine deodorizers, carpet powders); Fuels; Insecticides (e.g. mosquito coil, paper, electrical, for clothing) excluding aerosols/sprays; Joss sticks or incense sticks; Dishwash detergent and deodorizers - for machine wash; Olfactive board games; Paints; Plastic articles (excluding toys); Scratch and sniff; Scent pack; Scent delivery system (using dry air technology); Shoe polishes; Rim blocks (toilet).</p>
